K-8TH CORNER: MEET GRACE

GRACE'S HARD WORK & PERSISTENCE IN ACTION!

We met Grace, age 9, in the fall of 2020 and her mom Madison. They participated in virtual after school programming on a consistent basis. Since the initial referral, Madison and Grace have moved a total of four times in the 2020-2021 school year, moving from shelters to doubling up with family to recently moving into their new home with support.

This summer we were able to meet Grace in person, on her porch, with our new Mobile Learning Program. They were one of four initial families served in our pilot. She and her mother joined our tutoring team for weekly morning sessions. At a table set up

outside, Grace and her Mom participated in educational activities including reading new favorite stories and playing "store" to practice identifying and adding coins and bills. We also created science experiments with edible materials like the phases of the moon with Oreo cookies.

Grace attends Cyber School, as a third grade student, making virtual learning a norm for her, yet she still needed some extra support during Covid-19. During our virtual afterschool program, we've seen immense growth and confidence in Grace's reading and storytelling. She's a lively, energetic student who always shows up with a smile on her face ready to learn and contribute. We've also greatly enjoyed building a relationship with her mom, Madison, who is an amazing advocate for Grace's learning and well-being. We are so excited to continue to work alongside Grace and her mother this year, to build upon progress.

DR. BARBARA BIGLAN AND FAMILY

Barbara Biglan is known as "Dr. B" to her former students. To us, she is known as a caring neighbor who has a heart for the youth we serve. Living in Oakmont with her husband, Dr. Albert Biglan, Barbara is retired from a long and varied teaching career, where she encountered students from pre-school to college.

When she talks about her students,

she emanates love. She said she encourages new teachers-to-be, telling them: "You will love teaching! Just look at the kids. My love was returned 7 million times." Reflecting back, she adds, "the smile on their faces was all I needed to stay motivated."

This genuine love of children and of education is the best, right? Dr. B. encourages her family to make HCEF part of their charitable giving, as each year they decide where to put their philanthropic dollars. When asked why HCEF resonates, Barbara said "The children you serve may think it's their fault that they are experiencing difficulties. It isn't. Kids deserve all the love and belief in them that is possible to give them. If you give them that, they can carry that the rest of the way."

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: MEET BRIANNA!

Meet Brianna! (*not her real name) We met the 18-year-old when she applied for a Hope Through Learning Award. Before the start of Brianna's senior year of high school, she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. Determined to finish school and make a better life for her and her son. Brianna focused hard on her schoolwork.

Brianna's hard work paid off, and she not only graduated but was accepted to Community College of Allegheny County. Her journey and success made her eligible for the 2021 Hope Through Learning Award. Brianna was honored in our annual HTLA event at Phipps Conservatory with eight of her peers and received \$2,500 to continue her education. Each awardee had the chance to meet their fellow awardees, HCEF staff and board, and they also received bedding and a backpack so they can start the year off right.

This summer Brianna participated in the Summer Yoga & Mindfulness program hosted by Danielle Thum and our partners at UPMC. Danielle serves as Health & Prevention Program Manager of UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh's Family Care Connection centers. Summer Yoga & Mindfulness were held once a week outside of the Oakland branch Carnegie Public Library. Along with program participation incentives Brianna received early childhood intervention support for her son.

The Teen Outreach Program highlights Brianna for pursuing her dreams through education and taking steps to ensure her child is given the necessary supports for healthy development.
