Aaliyah is 20, and one of our scholarship winners this summer. She had plans after graduation to pursue post-secondary education to become a Registered Nurse, however, she felt with everything going on in her life at the time going to college immediately wasn't her best option.

With the increasing demand for health care providers, Aaliyah decided to take two training courses that would prepare her to become a Home Health Aide. These courses enabled her to reignite her passion for helping others. It also re-affirmed her desire to continue her education and become a nurse.

She now has secured a financially stable job which has allowed her the opportunity to secure housing and move to a new home. We could not be prouder of what Aaliyah has been able to accomplish. We are currently assisting her to continue her dream and get into a UPMC CNA to RN program.

Willa (*not her real name) is a shy but enthusiastic 11-year-old girl in 5th grade and new mobile learning student. Willa is currently doubling up, living with four generations of women in one house. From day one, Willa has been open about her feelings regarding school and expressed being bullied by her peers. Her social and emotional skills have continued to progress as she receives support from our HCEF staff team, her tutors and family.

As an enthusiastic reader, Willa has expressed interest in one of her favorite graphic novel book series "Smiles" by Raina Telgemier. To build on this love of reading, we recently started a book club with Willa, and introduced the next book series "Guts," which also sounds like fun!

We love seeing Willa's confidence bloom. When we first met, she struggled to share answers, and appeared to be second guessing herself, even when her answer was correct. After a few sessions with positive reinforcement, her confidence has improved, and she more readily offers answers.

Her ability to problem-solve has also improved. Early on, Willa needed support with multiplication facts. We used flash cards and games to focus on improvement, and it worked. She demonstrated this when after initially having a hard time with a game called
