# Homeless Children's Education Fund Announces \$500,000 in Transformative Foundation Support

**Pittsburgh, Pa** – The Homeless Children's Education Fund (HCEF) is proud to announce three major foundation grants totaling \$500,000 - \$250,000 from The Heinz Endowments, the largest foundation gift in the organization's 26-year history, \$150,000 from The McElhattan Foundation and \$100,000 from The Pittsburgh Foundation.

These combined investments will fuel HCEF's general operations and its Continuum of Programming Model, a longitudinal, comprehensive support system that serves students experiencing homelessness from early childhood through adulthood, while also addressing immediate needs resulting from gaps in federal funding and general operating support.

"This generous support from The Heinz Endowments, The McElhattan Foundation and The Pittsburgh Foundation represent far more than financial assistance, it represents a lifeline," said AJ Jefferson, president and CEO. "It sends a powerful message to our students that their community sees them, believes in them and is committed to their future. When a child's world is uncertain, education serves as an anchor. These grants help us keep that anchor strong, ensuring our students can continue learning, growing and thriving despite the challenges they face."

The funding arrives at a pivotal time, as shifts in federal policies and programs continue to affect the region's most vulnerable students. Families are facing urgent needs, such as food, clothing, and housing, threatening the stability and future of the children and youth HCEF serves. Support from The Heinz Endowments, The McElhattan Foundation and The Pittsburgh Foundation enable HCEF to respond to these challenges while safeguarding the resources needed to reach 1,500 children by 2027.

"In this time of uncertainty and changes in federal policy and funding, we are pleased to support HCEF's innovative, comprehensive approach to ensuring children and youth experiencing homelessness have the resources and opportunities they need to succeed," said Endowments Equity & Learning Vice President Carmen Anderson. "Strategic partnerships like this reflect our belief that every young person deserves a chance to learn, thrive and contribute to a stronger Pittsburgh."

HCEF's Continuum of Programming Model meets students where they are, providing consistent support from early learning through post-secondary education. Families with young children participate in enrichment workshops that spark creativity and school readiness. Elementary students receive targeted tutoring and enrichment; high schoolers build leadership, financial literacy, and workforce readiness skills; and post-secondary students access coaching, financial aid, and career guidance.

The results are compelling. Students engaged in three or more Continuum programs achieve a 90% retention rate, and at least 90% of HCEF high school seniors graduate or earn their GED, well above the national average for students experiencing homelessness.
